Clyfwchwr

The coraclers will fish during the *Clyfwchwr*.

It is the time between dawn and dusk usually about 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. In the picture the two coracles are waiting for the tide to turn.

They will know the correct time when the water level is the level of **the fourteenth step.**



The men will wait for the seven stars that give them hopefully enough light to fish by.



Tradition tells us that the coraclers waiting for the seven stars in the sky is linked to the legend of Arthur and **Merlin**.

The wizard believed that the seven stars they were waiting for were the seven warriors who would return from the Battle of **Camlann**.

Camlann was a fierce battle that took place not far from Dolgellau in North Wales.

King Arthur and his villainous rival, Mordred are supposed to have died at the battle.
