## Strategy for Tackling Domestic Abuse

The Welsh Assembly Government's recently launched national strategy on Tackling Domestic Abuse provides a framework for developing domestic abuse policy in Wales.

Described as the backbone for facilitating local policy development over the next three years, the strategy lays great emphasis on strengthening joint-agency working and establishing strong local service networks through existing Community Safety Partnerships.

Assembly Government Minister for Social Justice and Regeneration, Edwina Hart, said at the launch of the strategy that more detailed policies for implementing the Strategy are to be incorporated in to each Partnership's Community Safety Plan.

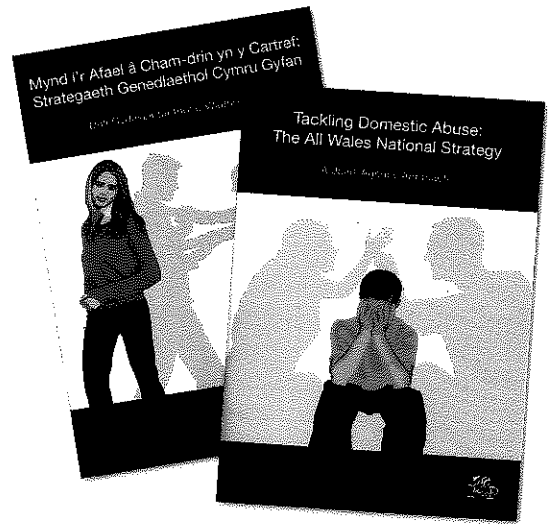
Welsh Women's Aid is represented on the Assembly Government's Working Group on Domestic Violence and Violence against Women, which was involved in drawing-up the strategy.

For our member groups' interests to be represented in each community's Safety Plan, and for Welsh Women's Aid to be consulted in drawing up detailed policies stemming from the strategy, our groups need to develop and maintain close links with relevant agencies and be represented on Community Safety Partnerships.

*Tackling Domestic Abuse: The All Wales*

### Key Points

- Three year framework for developing domestic abuse policy

National Strategy includes a wide, gender-neutral definition of domestic abuse and asserts that the main underlying principles are protection and support for victims of domestic abuse, perpetrator accountability and prevention of harm.

Welsh Women's Aid's new Director, Elen Pierce, says: "This is a key publication for our organisation, as it maps out the Welsh Assembly Government's priorities for developing domestic abuse policy over the next three years. As Wales' leading support network for women and

children experiencing abuse, this strategy will be our principle guide and main focus for service development and partnership working.

"To inform the implementation of the Strategy, Welsh Women's Aid must be in a position to access robust, accurate and up to date statistics and data on our groups and the women and children being supported by them, which is why the use of the Datagate database package by local Women's Aid groups in Wales will be greatly welcomed".

## New additions to the Welsh Women's Aid Team

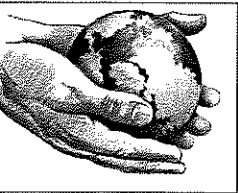


Welsh Women's Aid's New Director, Elen Pierce

Welsh Women's Aid's newly appointed Director is Elen Pierce. Elen, who is from Caernarfon, joins the national team after 10 years as a fundraising manager with Childline Cymru. She is a fluent Welsh speaker and now lives in Swansea. She says: "I'm still settling in to my new role and identifying areas of work that need to be prioritised, and I'm looking forward to meeting many of you at Welsh Women's Aid's Annual Conference at the University of Glamorgan in September."

Also new to the national team is the Wales Domestic Abuse Helpline's Manager, Tracey Jones. Also a Welsh speaker, Tracey, who is from Llandanell Fab on Anglesey was most recently employed by Ynys Mon Women's Aid. She says: "The Wales Domestic Abuse Helpline was a year old in March, and I'm really happy to be joining such an essential service that's growing from strength to strength. The Helpline will soon be undergoing an evaluation by the Welsh Assembly Government and I'm confident that we'll be successful in getting continued funding."

### Need for robust data on services to women and children



All Welsh Women's Aid member groups are now trained to use the Datagate database package. Using the tried and tested system will enable Welsh Women's Aid to collate statistics coherently, as all the information will be supplied to is in the same format.

For Welsh Women's Aid to be in a strong position to inform the implementation of the All Wales National Strategy on Tackling Domestic Abuse we need to have robust, accurate and up to date statistics on the work of our member groups and the women and children being supported.

The All Wales National Strategy (see front page) stresses that reliable statistics are needed to realistically assess the scale of domestic abuse and the effectiveness of services for women and children.

Using Datagate will also benefit Women's Aid groups at a local level by standardising the way data is collated.

It would be wonderful to have everybody familiar with and confident using Datagate before the end of the year, as we're planning for it to be live and up and running in April 2006.

Any difficulties with using Datagate should be addressed to Gill Edwards at Welsh Women's Aid's Cardiff office, or flagged up with Gill during the Autumn training programme.

### CAFCASS Memorandum of Understanding



An agreement for closer partnership working between Welsh Women's Aid and the Children and Family Court Advisory and Support Service in Wales (CAFCASS Cymru) is now in place.

The main aim of the Memorandum of Understanding is to encourage better communication between Welsh Women's Aid member groups and CAFCASS Cymru, and to address and attempt to avoid unhelpful tension between both organisations.

The need for an agreement was highlighted after several of our member groups raised concerns about the apparent lack of domestic abuse awareness amongst CAFCASS practitioners and fears for the safety of children and their mothers in respect of contact orders with abusive fathers.

Emphasis is laid on proactive local communication between Women's Aid and CAFCASS Cymru staff, and meetings of Domestic Abuse Forums are seen as an opportunity for ongoing contact and information sharing. The Memorandum of Understanding also envisages reciprocal training and team visits for both organisations.

A complaints procedure is also provided, specifying that in the first instance problems should be dealt at a local level. If they cannot be resolved they should be referred to a national Welsh Women's Aid worker and/or a CAFCASS member of staff, who will endeavour to find a way forward.

The Memorandum of Understanding will be circulated to Welsh Women's Aid member groups in due course.

## Congratulations...

...to Amman Valley Women's Aid for being awarded £80,000 from the Assembly's Community Safety Unit. The funding will go towards the cost of buying a property, which will be the base for administration and their floating support/outreach service. Known at the Amman Valley Women's Aid Joint Strength - Cyswilt Cryf, the property will also have space for other agencies to run surgeries for women and children affected by domestic abuse, the aim being to provide a more holistic service. With support from police, social services, health, local councillors and the Domestic Abuse Forum, a bid to the One Fund for the rest of the funding is currently being put together. Amman Valley should know by September if they're successful, and we'll update on progress. We wish you luck with your bid.

## News Flash

The transfer of Supporting People (SPRG) funding to local authority control has been delayed from April 2006 to April 2008.

## WDAH Update

Calls to the Wales Domestic Abuse Helpline (WDAH) have increased five-fold during its first year in operation.

The service, which will mark the first anniversary of its national launch in September, is now receiving on average over 800 calls a month. The majority of calls are from people experiencing domestic violence and abuse - 55% of all calls during its first year in operation.

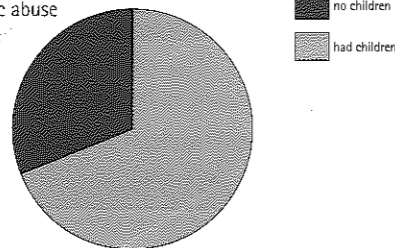
The Helpline is updating the way statistics are collated. The new Client Link package, which will be used in conjunction with Datagate, has been live since 1 June and allows for more efficient data gathering. For example, the number of callers referred to each refuge can be recorded, which

should be invaluable for our member groups when presenting statistics for funding purposes.

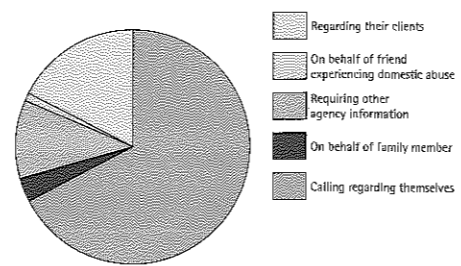
More comprehensive statistics and robust data will also enable the Helpline and Welsh Women's Aid to better represent affiliated member groups and inform policy makers (see article above).

## New Resource



Women's Federation of England's (WAFE) new website is an excellent resource for children and young people living in fear of domestic abuse, or those who may want to help a friend. It's called 'The Hideout' (www.thehideout.org.uk), and it uses language, graphics, check lists, quizzes and interactive games to help children explore issues surrounding domestic abuse, and provides information on safety planning and routes to help. In terms of our own website (www.welshwomensaid.org), the content is to be reviewed, and the possibility of setting up a Members' Area for affiliated groups is being explored.

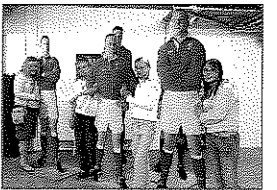
## Children Still Matter!

Welsh Women's Aid's Children's Group has continued to be well attended and I personally look forward to these meetings as an opportunity to have the face-to-face contact with child workers that is so essential to my post.

Over the past few meetings we have had contributions from Victim Support's Vulnerable Witness Service, Family Planning Association Youth Project workers, and most recently, specialist play workers who highlighted the significance of the newly designed Playwork principles to our field of work. They also gave practical play ideas for the summer. It is important not to lose sight of just how important play is to children as a means of learning, healing and self-expression.

The Spring training on Communicating with Children was well attended and received positive feedback. In response to requests from groups we have been working with external specialists to provide Autumn training on record keeping, data protection and information, which is something I know is an area of concern. We also aim to put on certificated training in Managing Challenging Behaviour and Physical Intervention in the early 2006.

Welsh Women's Aid was invited by the Children's Commissioner to send representatives to a consultation event in the Millennium Stadium. We were represented by six youth delegates aged between 13 and 17, coming from 4 of our member groups, and their feedback included 'a great experience' ..... 'awesome!' ..... 'educational' ... 'OK' ..... 'good to be listened to' .... 'a good day out'.

## Briefing - CHILDREN AND ADOPTION BILL, 2005

One of the main aims of the Bill, introduced into Parliament in June, is to give the courts new powers when dealing with contact arrangements for children following relationship breakdown.

It will allow the courts to instruct parents to take part in activities which "promote contact" when they are considering whether to make, change or discharge a contact order, and will provide a wider range of options to enforce compliance than is currently available.

Contact activities can be information and advice sessions about making contact arrangements, or programmes, classes, counselling or guidance

sessions that help to establish, maintain or improve contact with a child. These can include perpetrator programmes where domestic violence is an issue.

When orders are breached, the courts will be able to impose a community service order on the non-compliant parent or order them to pay financial compensation for any losses caused by withholding access, unless the person breaching the order has a "reasonable excuse".

Compulsory mediation is specifically excluded from "contact activities" and the proposal earlier in the year to impose curfews on parents denying contact, monitored through electronic tagging, has been dropped.

These are welcome omissions where domestic violence is an issue, but less welcome is the failure to include measures to require the courts to assess risk systematically and ensure that contact is safe for all concerned. The government continues to rely on ad hoc judgements in the courts to decide what is safe even though experience has shown these to be an inadequate tool for preventing harm to both mothers and children through contact arrangements.

## Routine Enquiry in to domestic abuse in Pregnancy rolled out throughout Wales



Every pregnant woman in Wales receiving antenatal care will be routinely asked about domestic abuse by the end of this year.

The Antenatal Care Pathway on Routine Enquiry into Domestic Abuse will aid midwives and health visitors to 'ask the question' to a woman when she's alone, and help them to become competent and confident in dealing with disclosures.

Training for NHS staff throughout Wales is currently being rolled out, and will be well under way by September.

When the Care Pathway is fully operational, all pregnant women will be given an information card outlining support services available to them, including details of local Women's Aid groups. With her consent, details of women at high risk will be addressed to local Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conferences (MARAC), or equivalent, and any child protection issues will be referred to relevant statutory authorities (consent not required).

The All Wales National Strategy on Tackling Domestic Abuse encourages the use of the Care Pathway as best practice during pregnancy.

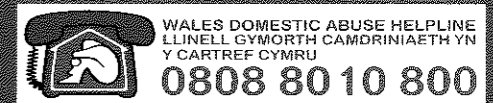
Glamorgan NHS Trust Midwife, Suzanne Hardacre, who was seconded to the Welsh Assembly to draw up the Care Pathway, said: "It is well documented that domestic abuse often starts or intensifies during pregnancy. The training for midwives and health visitors on using the Care Pathway will enable them to ask the necessary questions and to effectively deal with disclosure."

# The CPS and Witness Summonses

Welsh Women's Aid was recently contacted by the media and asked to respond to new Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) figures, which suggest a rise in the use of witness summonses for women ordered to testify against abusive partners in domestic violence cases. Here, Ian Griffiths of the CPS, who leads the Saff project in Caerphilly, explains the circumstances under which witness summonses will be ordered, and the work of the Saff project team .....

interest" to proceed is a very difficult question in cases of domestic violence (DV) where the complainant/survivor withdraws their support for the prosecution. In all DV cases, the safety of the survivor and any children must be paramount even though this may conflict with the complainant's wishes regarding giving evidence. Where a complainant withdraws support the CPS may use a "witness summons" to compel the survivor to attend court. This is not a device which is used lightly because it has the potential for punishing the survivor if they fail to comply with the summons.

The Crown Prosecution Service must satisfy the two stage test within the Code for Crown Prosecutors before a prosecution can be brought. Stage one requires that there is sufficient evidence to bring the prosecution. Stage two requires that the prosecution be in the "public interest".

However, many survivors prefer to be witness summoned because it allows them to distance themselves from the decision-making process and maintain that their attendance at court as a witness for the prosecution is a matter beyond their control. The attendance of such witness is often the crucial factor which leads to a change of plea from "not guilty" to "guilty", thus saving

the survivor from actually having to give evidence.

Project Saff Caerphilly is designed to assist the victim/survivor throughout the prosecution process and particularly to provide advice and support to those who may be considering withdrawal and thereby reduce the necessity for witness summonses. The Saff team comprises a lay advocate and two dedicated police officers together with a specialist CPS lawyer and caseworker.

The recent final independent evaluation of Project Saff has shown a statistically significant increase in the number of guilty pleas and, more importantly, the sensitive use of witness summonses coupled with the work of the Saff team has increased victim satisfaction in the criminal justice system.
