After a recent session, Jill Clay explained: "It is surprising how much can be achieved in an hour and how much this activity enhances the village environment. Cardiff University Research into Dementia was the unexpected but utterly fascinating talk at the February WI meeting. Alun PIRING WOMEN Meggy, a Research Technician

from the Division of Psychological Medicine and Clinical Neurosciences at Cardiff University, gave us an insight into the past and present research being carried, by the university and their world-renowned partners, to understand and improve the lives of people with dementia. He reported that a new case of dementia is diagnosed somewhere in the world every 4 seconds, and by 2030 it is estimated that there will be approximately 75 million people with dementia. The Dementia Research Institute at Cardiff University is designed to address this significant health challenge. Alun shared the initial findings from exciting collaborative research between UK and US institutions. Alun answered our questions about dementia; debunked a few myths; described different types of dementia and urged us to register with 'Join Dementia Research' and become part of a world-wide study.

One of our very active 90+year old members is currently participating in a study. I think she was very pleased to hear that cases of Alzheimer's after 85+ are very rare indeed. For more information about the research contact: www.joindementiaresearch.nihr.ac.uk
