23 High Street today covers what in the 18th century - and probably earlier - was two properties. The corner one covered one burgage; the adjacent property being 3/4 burgage, was known as The Black Horse. The building is Grade Il listed 'for surviving 17th century structure and group value with adjacent listed buildings'. The water pump, against it south east elevation, was Grade Il listed in 1981 (amended 1999) – 'scarce 19th century water pump with group value with Town Hall and no 23 High Street'. The telephone box outside no. 23 (1999) was similarly Grade Il listed 'included for its contribution to conservation area'.
