

23 High St

23 High Street today covers what in the 18th century - and probably earlier - was two properties. The corner one covered one burgage; the adjacent property being 3/4 burgage, was known as The Black Horse. The building is Grade II listed 'for surviving 17th century structure and group value with adjacent listed buildings'. The water pump, against its south east elevation, was Grade II listed in 1981 (amended 1999) - 'scarce 19th century water pump with group value with Town Hall and no 23 High Street'. The telephone box outside no. 23 (1999) was similarly Grade II listed 'included for its contribution to conservation area'.

1684 Mary Ralfe, widow, will. Bequeaths to son William Ralfe all the vessels in the brewhouse.

1749 Nathaniel Taynton devises house near Bridewell and a leasehold house adjoining (formerly the Black Horse, the freehold of which he afterwards purchased) to his son Nathaniel - document found in box of deeds of 67 High St
