

35 High Street

35 – 35a High St : in 1844 these two houses, together with a garden behind, were owned by William Davies, and occupied by Morgan Thomas (no.35) and Edward Ballard (no 35a). The details of the census enumeration for the property has yet to be worked out. It is clear however that what was historically one burgage had already been split into two by 1844. *Unknown source*

A grade II listed building, 'late 18th/early 19th century pair whose surviving character includes good panelled doors within pedimented doorcases'. CADW/RCAHM
