

The will of Dorothy Carne of Cowbridge, widow, dated 30th., November 1726.

All her estate to her daughter Cessil Williams as executrix.

In the Name of God Amen I Dorothy
 Curie of the Town of Cambridge in the County of
 Gloucestre and Diocess of Exeter wife of God bless'd
 and mercifull man my husband William Curie of the same
 Town of Cambridge in the County of Gloucestre
 do hereby give and bequeath unto the said
 my daughter Rebecca Curie the sum of Ten
 poundes of Lawfull Money of Great Brittain
 to be paid unto her at the death of my said
 husband or at the death of my said daughter
 if she shall die before me and if she shall
 die before me and my said daughter then
 the said sum of Ten poundes shall be paid
 unto my said daughter or her heirs or assigns
 forever.

Given under my hand and seal of my said
 husband William Curie at Cambridge in the County
 of Gloucestre the 10th day of October 1726
 and I Dorothy Curie do hereby ratify and confirm
 the said bequest and do hereby give and bequeath
 unto my said daughter Rebecca Curie the sum
 of Ten poundes of Lawfull Money of Great
 Brittain to be paid unto her at the death
 of my said husband or at the death of my
 said daughter if she shall die before me
 and if she shall die before me and my said
 daughter then the said sum of Ten poundes
 shall be paid unto my said daughter or her
 heirs or assigns forever.
