In the Name of God, Amen
I Thomas Thomas of the Town of Cowbridge
in the County of Glamorgan Master &
Jury-keeper do make this my last Will
and Testament in manner and form
following (that is to say), I being in sound
& perfect mind and memory do commit
my soul into the power of God and my
Body to the Grave to be buried at the
discretion of my Executrix which I now
appoint. I give and Bequeath unto
my dearly beloved Wife Mary Thomas
All my Estate both Real and personal
and all effects of what kind so ever
possessed of, and I do appoint her my
Sole & Lawfull Executrix and none
else to have the Management of
every thing or any else but her self.
As Witness my hand this second of April
in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven
hundred and thirty four.
