To his son Henry Hancock 1s.

To his daughter Katherine the wife of William Beasley 1s.

All the rest to his son William Hancock as executor.

This is the last Will and Testament of the Thomas Hancock of Northon in the Parish of Lambeth in the County of Glamorgan in the Dominion of Wales Cooper made this Third Day of June in the year of our Lord Christ One Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty One First I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Hancock and to my Daughter Katherine the Wife of William Beasley the Sum of One Shilling each to be paid them severally by my Executor hereinafter named All the Rest and Residue of my Goods and Chattels Debts Credits Money and Securities for Money whatsoever and whosoever I give and bequeath unto my son William Hancock whom I do hereby make nominate constitute Ordain and appoint to be whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former and other Wills by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the Day and year above said
