

The will of Thomas Jenkins of Breach, Llanblethian, yeoman, dated 19th., November 1764.

To his great granddaughter, Elinor Lewis the daughter of Thomas Lewis of Cardiff, ^{hatmaker,} £25 on reaching 21. Should she die before the age of 21 then the sum was to be divided between any other children of Thomas Lewis and Elinor ^{his wife} (Jenkins' granddaughter). Should none survive then the sum was to pass to the executrix. This sum of £25 was to be put to use and the interest paid to Elinor ^(granddaughter) or any other children who may survive until the age of 21.

Whereas his son John Jenkins was in debt to him concerning land in Coychurch - Cae Grobwsbren, Caia Cambern and Gwain Boxor, some sixteen and a half acres, these debts were to be discharged if his son accepted the terms of the will and any action by the executrix which would benefit his grandson Jenkin Williams the son of John Williams of Breach.

The rest of his goods to his daughter Mary the wife of John Williams as executrix.





In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Perkins of Beards
in the Parish of Lambollton in the County of Glamorgan
Common being weak in Body but of sound Mind Memory and
Understanding Do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament to remaining my soul into the Hands of Almighty
God and my Body to the Earth to be decently buried at
the Discretion of my Executors hereinafter named And as
for and concerning my temporal Estate I give and
dispose thereof in Manner following that is to say I give
and bequeath to my Great Granddaughter Anne daughter
Daughter of Thomas Lewis of the Town of Cardiff in the said
County Glamorgan the sum of Twenty five Pounds to be paid
her when she attains the Age of one and twenty Years and
in Case she does not so the attainment of such Age I give and
bequeath the said sum of Twenty five Pounds to the Children
of the said Thomas Lewis to wit her Wife my Granddaughter
to be equally divided between them and if there be but one other
Child together between them then to such one other Child to be
paid likewise ~~between the Children of such Age~~
of one and twenty and in Case neither of such
Children shall attain that Age I give and bequeath the said sum
of Twenty five Pounds to my Executors hereinafter named
And I do desire that the Interest of the said sum of Twenty five
Pounds shall be paid yearly to my said Granddaughter Anne
the Wife of the said Thomas Lewis during the Minority of such of
Age as shall be entitled to the said Legacy towards her or
their Administrators and in Case of her Death during that Time
that my Executors or her Executors Executors shall apply such
Interest for the purpose aforesaid Whereas my son John Perkins
is now indebted unto the said Anne ~~and Anne of the~~
several Coves following that is to say the Glamorgan
Cove and Gwain Cove lying in the Parish of
Lambollton in the said County containing by the whole
the Area Acres and the part of one Acre for many Years last
past amounting to a considerable sum of Money Now therefore
my Will is and I do hereby order and direct that he shall
not be molested for the same by my Executors in Case my
said son does not oppose the resolution of this my Will or any
other Act or Deed which I have executed or at any time

hereafter shall accrue for the Benefit or Advantage of my
 Grandson Sir John Williams Son of John Williams of Bristol
 aforesaid But if my said Son shall in any Manner oppose or
 retard the Execution of this my Will or any other my last or last
 said Sir John Williams I do hereby declare that my Will is that
 my said Son shall not be discharged from such Rent and Arrear-
 of Rent and I do expressly direct and require my said Executors
 to sue for and recover all such Rent and Arrear of Rent as shall
 be due from him at the Time of my Death and any Thing herein
 contained to the contrary notwithstanding All the Rent and
 Residue of my personal Estate Goods and Chattels I give and
 bequeath to my Daughter Mary the Wife of the said John
 Williams And I do hereby nominate and appoint her sole
 Executrix of this my last Will and Testament lawfully executing
 all former Wills by her made and observing this to be my last
 full Will which I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal
 this Twentieth Day of November in the Year of our said Lord
 Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty four
