

The will of John Richard of Trehingill, Llanblethian, a yeoman, dated 13th.,? 30th.
November 1768.

To his brother George Richard, £100 to be paid within a month of death, and to assist the executrix in raising such sums as necessary.

The rest of his estate to his wife Margaret as executrix. However if she should remarry then the estate should pass to his brother George.

In the Name of God, Amen. I John Richard of Hekingill in the
Parish of Lanbecthan in the County of Glamorgan Yeoman, being
Sick & weak in Body, but of sound and perfect Mind & Memory,
thanks be to All mighty God, do make & Ordain this my last Will
& Testament as followeth. First I give & bequeath to my beloved
Brother George ~~Wills~~ Richard the sum of one Hundred Pounds of
good & lawfull Money of Great Britain to be paid him within one
Month after my Decease by my executrix here after mentioned
and I do further enjoin him to be assistant to my executrix in
rising whatsover Sums of money I have out in other Hands
and it is my Will and Desire that if any Part of such money
^{can} will not be received that he my said Brother and my executrix
to be here after mentioned should equally suffer the loss. All the
rest and residue of my Goods and Chattels of what kind soever
they be, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret
her Executors assigns and Administrators. but in case my said
wife shall marry, immediately after the said Marriage to my
Brother George before mentioned. And I do appoint my beloved
Wife Margaret above mentioned Sole & whole executrix of this
my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former
wills by me made. In witness hereof, I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal this thirteenth Day of November
in y^e Year of our Lord, one Thousand, Seven Hundred &
Sixty eight.

first on the oath. She being personally sworn well and faithfully to

her Administration thereof, when thereunto lawfully required.
