 do hereby certify that being sick in body but of sound and perfect
 memorye Laude and prayse be unto almighty God I do make my
 last will and Testament in manner and forme following, viz. I do
 bequeath my soule into the hands of Almighty God my maker and
 redde me, And my body to be buried in Christian burghall, I do
 bequeath unto the Cathedral Church of Landaxpe viz. I do
 give and bequeath to the right Church of Colchester viz. I do
 give and bequeath unto my Sonne Thomas out standing bedstead
 one feather bed, ^{and bolster} one green frise rugge or Sadew, one pair
 of shoes, one pillow, one table board, one bed frame and three iron
 stools, one Surrin, and my greatest pbring panett and my greatest
 brass pott, and my best trunche. I do bequeath unto my daughter
 Margaret two best surs as she shall chuse of all my gyses, Item
 one bedstead that lyeth in the little chamber, one table boarde that lyeth
 in the forsyde chamber, one dust bedd, ^{one feather} one pair of blanketts
 one pane, one iron pott, one great and crooked, one grandone
 next unto my best grandone, I do give and bequeath unto my
 Sonne Edward my greatest gys, one little trunche, I do will in
 that if any goods of myne (excepting those that are bequeathyd before)
 do remaine (after my debts are all payed & discharged) shall equally
 be divided betwixt my forre children. I do constitute and
 appoint ^{John} my wyffe to be my only and ^{sole} executrix of this my last
 will and Testament, unto whom I do give and bequeath the 2/3
 of all my ^{sayd} goods and chattels movables and immovables during
 her widowhood. In witness whereof I have subscribed with
