our lord Christ one thousand six hundred sixty six being
in my body but of perfect memory ~~and~~ then declare and
publish her last will in substance as followeth or words
to this effect, I doe give & bequeath unto my two daughters
Honitt and Ellenor all my goods cattells & chattells personall
wherewith my debts may be paid and the overplus unto them
my said daughters, and that my daughter Mary might receive
from my said daughters Honitt & Ellenor what their father
gave them before he died, then uttering that they all
knew the same that were the day above mentioned in being
