 my son David John and my daughter Jane John to be my
 Exe-tors of this my last will and testament revoking all
 other former wills and testaments Item I ordaine my wife Jane
 John and my brother in Law Jonkin Jemson and Casin
 John Edmunds to be affiants over my Children as witnesses
 my hand the day and year above written sealed and
 delivered in the presence of all the sums of money above ^{mentioned}
 to be paid in ^{twelve} months after my decease
