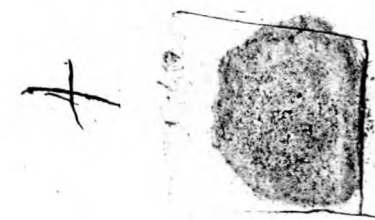
How. Thomas

I, Thomas of the parish of St Mary-hill in the
 County of Glamorgan being weak in body but of sound and perfect
 memory (praised be God) do make this my last will and testament
 in manner and forme following; first I commend and bequeath
 my soule to the hands of Almighty God my maker & redeemer
 trusting to be saved by the merits and passion of his only son
 and my only saviour Christ Iesus. Next I bequeath my
 body to be buried in Christian buriall. As for my worldly goods
 wherof God hath made me a steward. I give and bequeath
 bequeath towards my parish church of St Mary hill two
 shillings, and five shillings more to the poor of the same
 parish to be paid after my decease. Item I give and bequeath
 to Catharin John my wellbelov'd wife four mibre kind and
 one horse, Item I give and bequeath to my daughter
Margarett Jonkin two kind; Item I give and bequeath to my
 son Thomas Jonkin the bed in the hall wth his appurtenances, the
 table, the Cupboard and the chest that begeth catenals
 for the residue of my household stuffe. I give and bequeath
 to my said son Thomas Jonkin & to my said daughter Margarett
Jonkin to be equally divided betwene them after their mothers
 decease; Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Jonkin
 one bedsteepe, one table and frame being in the other house, called
 by draw, after his mothers decease, and not before; Item I
 give and bequeath to my son John Jonkin five pounds in money.
 Item I give and bequeath unto Wattin Wm my grandchilde four
 Ewes; Item I give and bequeath to Jondt Wm my grandchilde
 four Ewes; Lastly, I do nominate, constitute and appoint
 my said son Thomas Jonkin sole executor of this my last
 will and testament, In witness wherof I have hereunto
 put my hand and seale the third day of August, In the
 year of our Lord God 1656
