## COWBRIDGE.

### WITH THE VILLAGE OF LLANBLETHIAN AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

UOWBRIDGE is a borough and small market-town, [ the parish and hundred of its name, county of stile bottom, surrounded by a well-cultivated country. 'etown consists chiefly of one long street, stretching m cast to west, containing some well-built houses, a an-hall, and convenient market-house. It is a con--butory borough, with Cardiff and Llantrissaint, in surning one member to parliament; and is governed ta mayor and two bailiffs, who are elected by the agesses, the former officer for life, the latter annually. fourt of record may be holden under charter of harles II, but the corporation do not avail themselves (the privilege; the only court is one of commonuncil, held as occasion may require, for transacting x borough business. This place is without manu-tures; and its trade, which is local and domestic, schiefly supported by those engaged in agriculture, ad by its market and fairs.

The places of worship are the parish church of Saint the parish and hundred of its name, county of Mary, and chapels for Baptists, and Wesleyan and Imorgan; 172 miles w. from London, 12 w. from Calvinistic Methodists. The living of Cowbridge is a adiff, and 7 E. from Bridgend ; situated in a pleasant | rectory, in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Glou-The only charity is an endowed grammarcester. school, founded by Sir Leoline Jenkins, who was secretary of state in the reign of James II.; the revenue is about £20, per annum. The market is held on Tuesday; and there are seven fairs in the year, namely, first Tuesday in February, Tuesday before 25th March, 4th of May, 24th of June, first Tuesday in August, 29th of September, and the first Tuesday in December. The markets and fairs are well attended, and are chiefly for cattle of all kinds. The parish of Cowbridge contained, in 1831, 1,097 inhabitants; and in 1841, 1,080.

LLANBLETHIAN is a parish, in the hundred of Cowbridge; the village being situate about one mile s. w. from that town. There is nothing worthy of particular note connected with this parish-the population of which, in 1831, was 670; and in 1841, 724.
