Parish of Llanblethian charities - summary by Jeff Alden

William Gibbon of Newton – will 18/09/1809. Dividend of £100 to vicar of Llanblethian for distributing the same on Christmas day to industrious poor of the parish.

Lanhead – gifts of 11 people. Purchased 2 acres of customary land called Lanhead (leading to Llantwit Major, being opposite and in sight of the church) and rent of land per yearly at Christmas for poor parishioners.

Lewis & Nicholl's charities. – Howell Lewis £20, Stephen Nicholl £5 interest – for use of poor by 1862 and invested in cottage.

Sant's – Margaret Sant gave £1.40 pa from two meadows in Aberthin on Llanharan road (Bread)

Thomas – A field containing 3 acres on Stalling Down – rent paid by John Bevan (Bread)

Williams – 12 shillings per year was payable in 1710 till 1807, on a house (long since fallen down) and garden at the East Gate, now the property of Captain Tyler.

David's – Richard David gave £10. Interest to be applied for bread for poor.

Sir Leoline Jenkins - £20 every 4th year in clothing and blankets to poor parishioners by the master of the free grammar school in Cowbridge.

Evan Jenkins - rent of lands:

- (1) Keep in order tenor bell of Llanblethian church (gift of Sir Leoline Jenkins)
- (2) Equally in Llanblethian and Ystradowen to repair of both parish churches
- (3) Bind poorest sort of children apprentices
- (4) Relieve old labourers unable to work.

Donor unknown – House near Dissenting chapel in Aberthin (occupation rent free by poor persons) and two and three quarter acres (to service and repair parish church).

Donor unknown – House and croft, three quarter acres by Llanblethian bridge, to the use of church. Cottage kept in repair out of poor-rates; occupied rent free by poor persons. On stone tablet in front of building: 'Remember the Poor'. The land, half acre, lies under Llanblethian castle, part of garden attached to Capt. Royds' cottage, to whom it is let at the full rent of £2.6s.6d
