This is the last will and Testament of me Nathaniel Young of the Town of Cowbridge in the county of Glamorgan Sadler made this twenty ninth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight

I give and devise all those my five freehold messuages or dwelling houses with their appurtenances situate in Church Street in the said town of Cowbridge, and also my leasehold interest in a certain dwelling house called The Old Workhouse in Church Street aforesaid, a certain range of freehold Cottages, a Nailer's shop and other hereditments which I have agreed to purchase of the Guardians of the Bridgend and Cowbridge Union, two customary or copyhold cottages with their appurtenances situate at a place called Penylan near Newton in the parish of Llanblethian in the said county, and all other my real estate whatsoever (subject to an annuity or yearly rent charge herein after mentioned) unto my Nephew Nathaniel Llewellyn his heirs executors and administrators according to the several tenures of the respective premises so devised, to him as aforesaid.

I give and devise unto my sister Anne Llewellyn Widow for the term of her natural life one annuity or yearly rent charge of Ten pounds clear of all deductions payable half yearly the first payment to be made at the end of six calendar months after my decease and my will is that the said annuity shall be recoverable by distress on the premises herein before devised to the said Nathaniel Llewellyn or any part thereof on non payment within twenty one days after the same shall become payable as aforesaid.

I give and bequeath my household furniture, stock in trade, book-debts, and all other my personal estate whatsoever (subject to the payment of my just debts, funeral and testamentary expences) unto the said Nathaniel Llewellyn his executors administrators and assigns to and for his own use and benefit absolutely and Ihereby nominate and appoint the sais Nathaniel Llewellyn sole Executor of this my last will and testament.
