In addition to the four-part, participatory singing that gives the weekend its name and is the major event, there will be the following:

• A "musical tour of Wales" by the renowned Llanelli Male Voice Choir

 A folk concert featuring the Welsh group Plethyn and local Celtic favorites Magical Strings

• A traditional Welsh *eisteddfod* (ice-STETH-vod)—a choral and instrumental music competition

Hymn-singing festival details

The gymanfa ganu will take place on Sunday, September 4, in Meyenbauer Center. Many of the Welsh hymn tunes are very familiar to U.S. congregations—"Jesus, Lover of My Soul" (*Aberystwyth*),"Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah" (*Cwm Rhondda*), "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" (*Diadem*), "Come, Thou Long–Expected Jesus" (*Hyfrydol*), and "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" (*Llanfair*), to name but a few.

There will be two gymanfa sessions, one at 2:30 p.m. and a second at 6 p.m. Each session consists of 16 hymns, sung in groups of four, in both Welsh and English in four-part harmony.

The \$5 general admission price covers both sessions. Tickets may be purchased at the door or order in advance by sending a stamped, self–addressed envelope and check made out to Puget Sound Welsh Association to PSWA, P.O. Box 19344, Seattle, WA 98109. For more information, call 43-7288.
