LEADERSHIP

Glynn Jones - A July, 1994, recipient of the title of Honorary Fellow of Music and Drama of the University of Wales, Glynn will entertain, as well as educate, as our Gymanfaoedd director. A native of Merthyr Tydfil, he is best known as the director of Cor Meibion Pendyrus, a responsibility he has fulfilled for over thirty years. Glynn has conducted several Gymanfaoedd in North America and was also honored to be the conductor of the first National Gymanfa Ganu held in Cardiff, Wales in 1991.

The Reverend Maxwell Roberts - Born in Wales, along the Gower Coast, Maxwell Roberts has exercised his talents in the fields of education and the ministry. He and his wife, Prydwen, currently residents of Ilderton, Ontario, Canada, continue to share their faith with Welsh-Americans. Both have actively participated in leadership positions in Welsh Heritage Week. Maxwell Roberts will present the sermon during the Bilingual Morning Worship Service and Prydwen will assist as lay reader, as they have done so often at Rehoboth Welsh Chapel.

Glenys Wynn - Glenys Wynn, a native Welsh-speaker, brings her own special personality and humor to our Noson Lawen. In her profession as a teacher she has educated children in the Welsh language, music and dramatic recitation. Her other pursuits include amateur acting and a heartfelt dedication to supporting her home chapel, Trinity Chapel, in Sketty.

PERFORMANCE

The Pendyrus Male Choir - The Pendyrus Male Choir has thrilled audiences in Australia, the Far East, Europe, and the United States. This 100 voice choir will delight audiences at the Grand Concert and Gymanfa Ganu sessions. Founded in 1924, in the miners' town of Tylorstown, they have performed under the baton of Glynn Jones for the past thirty years. Their Grand Concert program will feature a review of Welsh choral music from its inception to the present, as well as the premiere of Appalachian coal miners' songs newly arranged for male voices. Robert Huw Morgan, accomplished organist and accompanist, will appear with them.

PERFORMANCE

Calennig - Mick Tems and Pat Smith bring folk music to life with a new exuberance and vigor. At our Folk Concert and Tympath, they will feature music of South Wales and the rich English-language tradition of folk songs, ranging from stirring ballads to humorous tongue-twisters. Mick Tems is acknowledged across Europe as one of Britain's premiere players of the diatonic accordion. Pat Smith plays a haunting concertina and swinging spoons. Both will also be leading seminars on sea songs and chanties of the Welsh ports and traditions and customs of Wales. Join us for an evening of music and fun; the melodies will have you humming along; the rhythm will inspire you to clap your hands or tap your feet.

The Rehoboth Welsh Choir - Inspired by the example of Pendyrus and the desire to keep the spirit of Welsh music alive in America, members and friends of Rehoboth Welsh Chapel founded the group in 1985. Singing in Welsh and English the choir maintains an active repertoire of music from Welsh composers. As it attracts its membership from Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware, and the Washington suburbs, the group continues to grow under the leadership of director Donald King and co-director Ellen Barlag King. The choir will perform the liturgical selections during the Sunday Bilingual Worship Service.

The Bangor High School Marching Band - Uniformed in the colors and dress of the Welsh guard, no other group of young people could be a more fitting addition to our Civic Ceremony.

Robert Huw Morgan - The instrumental soloist at the evening Gymanfa and master of the keyboard, Robert Huw Morgan, organ accompanist to the Pendyrus Male Choir is a native of Wales and a graduate of St. John's College, Cambridge. He is continuing his studies in conducting and organ at Washington State University in Seattle. Robert has joined Pendyrus for several tours including those to America and Australia.

Louise Taliesin - California native, vocal soloist for the afternoon Gymanfa, Louise Taliesin, delights many audiences with her lovely soprano voice. She has appeared at the Aspen Music Festival and the Mozarteum. A recipient of numerous awards and scholarships, she sang at the Noson Lawen in Baltimore in 1988, soloed with the Rehoboth Welsh Choir during their 1992 Wales tour and was a soloist at the Gymanfa in Wilkes-Barre in 1993. She is currently an instructor in voice at the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, Maryland.

PERFORMANCE

John Allinson - A native of the Brecon area of Wales, is an internationally-known illustrator and muralist. The Welsh Office and the Cardiff Bay Development Corporation have both commissioned large scale murals and the South Wales Miners Memorial Fund a memorial sculpture in bronze. John will be taking time from his business partnership with Celtic Dreams, creators of illustrated speciality furniture, to exhibit his works depicting Welsh Humor. This exhibition, and a seminar, will be held during the weekend at the Susquehanna Galleries in Strawberry Square.

Donald Wilkinson King - Accompanist for the hymn singing at both Gymanfaoedd sessions, Donald King has distinguished himself in the Baltimore-Washington area as a choirmaster and accomplished organist. An organ studies graduate of the Peabody Conservatory, he also studied choral conducting with Ifor Jones and voice with Justin Williams. Although retired from full-time positions of choirmaster and organist, he continues his dedication to directing the Rehoboth Welsh Choir.

LOCATION

City of Harrisburg, - Located along the banks of the Susquehanna River, Harrisburg has been the state capital of Pennsylvania since 1812. Easily accessible by bus, train, car or plane, the city boasts a centrally located transportation terminal two blocks from our accommodations and an international airport. A showcase of Pennsylvania culture and heritage, the city boasts a reputation for the grandeur of its municipal structures and the scenic beauty of its parks and riverfront area.

The Forum - An exquisite Art Deco style building located only two blocks from the hotels, The Forum is the Center for Performing Arts for the state of Pennsylvania. For fifty-five years The Forum has hosted a wealth of amateur and professional talent. Strawberry Square - The charming speciality shops and casual restaurants of Strawberry Square are connected to the Hilton by an enclosed arcade. Strawberry Square's convenient shopping and Museum of Scientific Discovery provide the visitor a "place for food, fashion, & fun".

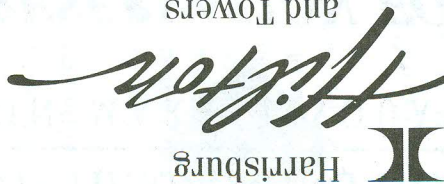
